## DVD, bad sweater party at Cornerstone

It's Uloth's DVD release/bad sweater Christmas party at the Cornerstone Theatre Dec. 14.

"We all have those bad sweaters so we thought, let's wear them and have some fun at each show," Uloth said.

The last time that Uloth came through town it was as a part of the Boob Tour — a perhaps more raunchy show — that raised \$5,500 for the Canmore and Area Health Foundation.

Uloth's idea is to include some up and comers who would be eager to showcase their talents at a more major show.

The comic said he's pleased to have the diminutive Canmore-born comic on tour with him once again.

"Canmore loves Amy and so do I," he said. Trofimuk, Uloth said, will be dressed as an elf. "If you are of elf proportions, you are wearing an elf costume, just like if you had a fat guy he'd be dressed up as Santa."

Chris Gordon, an accomplished comic, Uloth said, might up him in the ugly Christmas sweater department.

The DVD he's to release, Show Me Your Goody Bag, has a limited run of only 500 copies, and is only to be released around Alberta.

"It was a fun time," he said. It was one night in Calgary. "It was rowdy, it's what comedy really is.

"You get comedy in these huge theatres," he said. But in a smaller more intimate venue and in one take he displays his talents.

"When the audience is right up against you, obviously a packed audience is great, people sitting there with an open mind ready to laugh," he said makes for a good night.

Comedy at the Corner takes place at the Cornerstone Theatre Dec. 14.
